CHAIRMAN'S REPORT AND WELCOME

Welcome to Hartley Wintney Junior Football Club Trophy Day, 2021 - our annual celebration of the various Junior football teams' achievements and development. We have tried hard to find a time and date that suits as many as possible, and which didn't fall foul of Covid restrictions – so, after two postponements, Friday September 3rd it is. I hope you all enjoy this evening.

This season has seen continued change for good at the club despite the difficulties we have all encountered in our day to day lives; as a club there is still more that we want to do, and, with your help and support, we will look to consolidate what we have built and find new ways to develop our club. Above all else, I'm sure that we all want to get back to some semblance of normality – your understanding of all that we have tried to do in the face of lockdowns and restrictions has been much appreciated.

A significant achievement this year has been our elevation to FA Chartered Standard Community Club status, which acknowledges the most advanced level of club development and football provision. This is a huge leap for the club and a marque that we can all be rightly proud of – we are now one of a select handful of clubs in this area at this level. It reflects on our structure and how the club is run; that we have Club Officials who are proud to make our environment safe, fun, and inclusive for all;

the level of coaching we make available with several Level 2 coaches within the club; and the number and mix of male and female teams that we support.

During the season we were successful in becoming an FA Wildcats centre – Wildcats provides non-competitive football for girls aged 5 to 11 who want to give it a go for the very first time or want to play with other girls their own age. Our first few sessions have had a brilliant take up with nearly fifty girls at each – and the feedback has been fantastic. This dovetails nicely to our growing number of girls' teams – and we look to start the season ahead with three teams.

We also go into next season with four U7 teams – many of the boys and girls have been joining our weekly training sessions and are now looking forward to the Junior Football matchday experience. What is great is not only the numbers of players but the fact that we have coaches identified for each of our teams – we sponsor all new coaches to take the FA Level 1 coaching badge, and hope that this is the start of a rewarding journey through the age groups as a Hartley Wintney team manager.

As lockdown eased a little last summer, we were able to run a hugely successful Summer Football School; we changed the format a little which we believe was for the better. I genuinely believe that this gave all of those attending a chance to not only put in some pre-season training, but to also have loads of fun playing football. We are running the Football School once again this August – from Monday 23rd to Wednesday 25th – and it is open to all age groups. If you're interested, then please do sign up as soon as possible – this helps us manage numbers as well as making sure that we have the right numbers of coaches available across the three days.

A perennial struggle for any Junior Football club is pitches – we are no different. But we did play our first matches at the Lucy Pygott Centre, St Mary's Park - and this has allowed a different pitch layout to be put in place at



Greenfields and Jubilee. That, coupled with the FA Funding we have for ground improvements, has started to pay dividends – we still have a way to go, but I hope that everyone would agree that our pitches are getting better and looking healthier.

On the footballing front, I have to say huge congratulations to everyone on bringing this extended season through to a conclusion - and especially to those who made it through to a league, cup, or festival final. Hartley Wintney was well represented across the age groups which was great to see.

We are working on our budget for the season ahead – but a key part of this are the fantastic firms and individuals who are the sponsors for many of our teams. We really do appreciate this support and going in to 2021/22 season we have continued to have some very generous sponsors who will be a key part of the teams to which they are associated. Thank you – it really does mean a lot. And the same goes for everyone who sits behind the donation of auction and raffle prizes here – your generosity is much appreciated.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to everyone who volunteers, be that as an Officer, Committee Member, Manager or Assistant. Genuinely, it is all of you who help make this club what it is. We are always on the lookout for new volunteers, so please do get in touch if you want to help.

So on to our Trophy Evening, and a big thanks to Andrew Ewbank, Pete Auchterlonie and Lee Hulls; the driving force behind this evening. They have done a superb job in difficult circumstances to make this a celebration for all of us. After all, you and your children are why we are here to do what we do.

HWFC IN CONVERSATION WITH HWJFC

Over the last few seasons Duncan, myself, Nick E and a few other folk from the Juniors set up have made great strides in collaborating with HWFC to bring both the Junior Club and Senior Club closer together; and that collaboration continues season on season. So it makes sense to include some HWFC commentary in our annual Trophy Day programme. Accordingly I took the opportunity to sit down with Anthony Millerick to talk about HWFC's season ahead, ask him a few personal questions, and just, well, talk football. Here's how the conversation went...

Peter Auchterlonie: Millers, good to see you. Over a pint recently you've shared with me some of your thoughts about the season ahead for HWFC: care to share those thoughts with the wider HWJFC family?

Anthony Millerick: The money that has crept into non-league football over the last few years is like none we've ever encountered previously. It's not on us to judge how other clubs run their ships but the money they are apparently spending on players suggests they've become significantly richer during COVID. I fully back what we've done here which is continually improve and upgrade the facilities/clubhouse/training tools for the use of all, and long may that continue. We'll do what we've always done which is to unearth undiscovered gems, tame those mercurial talents that other clubs might not deem worth it, and enhance the good, solid group we've had here for a few seasons now.

PA: Great. So, a couple of losses and a win in the PSFs thus far (at the time of writing): what positives have you taken from those performances?

AM: Plenty, pre-season is a process and not results driven. Over all the games we've played, our core has always been ahead or dominant (even by the tight margins) before I've rung the changes. We are giving a lot of good young players the opportunity to showcase their talents and bid for a place in the squad, many of whom are from the u23s, and quite a few aren't far away. When you have a successful under 23s programme it's right that you look internally for the new players before going elsewhere.

PA: You mentioned the League's big spenders earlier. Faced with one of the smaller playing budgets in the league, how

can Hartley compete most effectively against these "bigger teams"?

AM: Same as always, be on the front foot and be aggressive. We can't control what other teams do or who they have in their squad so why worry; concentrate on what we do and maximise the time we have with the boys. Be organised, have a decent spirit within the camp and, whatever happens, let other teams know they've been in a game. That mantra has worked wonders over the years.

Finally, nobody likes coming to play here at Hartley so the more of a partisan crowd we get here (despite being wonderfully middle-class and friendly in the bar) the more teams won't fancy it, especially on miserable mid-week nights!

PA: I'll see what I can do to liven up the home fans with my pre-game, and in-game, match day announcements. What with the new U23 set up and the HWFC Academy; can the Row faithful expect to see the emergence of a young superstar or two this coming season? Foden, not Adu, preferably.

AM: Toby Raggett didn't come via the Hartley ranks but has already shone massively in spells. Young James Beauchamp has gone via the youth team and will feature this year. Both have tremendous talent and have featured heavily over the last 6 months. There are others in the u23s that are showing promise and hopefully we can get the conveyor belt working from the Junior youth upwards. We will give youth a chance if the talent is there!

PA: Great to here. So, the question you probably won't answer: Gazza famously once said, "I never make predictions, and I never will". Where do you predict Hartley will finish next season?

AM: Hahaha. I never do predictions as I set myself up. I don't do it with the squad either as it can be to the squad's detriment either way; aim too low and that's what they'll aspire to, aim high and miss and they'll be disappointed. I do predict a very strong second half of the season though.

PA: There's a fence over there with your name on it.

So you're an experienced football man, on and off the pitch, so I wanted to ask you a few questions about the game in general. First up is what, in your opinion, makes an excellent footballer at this level (Step 3) of the game?

AM: Dependent on region this question. Some parts of the world you need to be a goliath, here though technically solid is a good start but a desire to win and develop personally is important.

PA: Got it. So what about the oppo? Bobby Robson's standout quote for me is "We didn't underestimate them. They were a lot better than we thought". How much time do you spend analysing the oppo before a match?

AM: I take a brief overview of their key characteristics, shape and main players. I don't overload players with information, a few key points only as otherwise the message will get lost. We'll always be insular rather than look outwardly before or after game, regardless of the result.

PA: Great insight. So, if you were in charge of FIFA, what one change within the game would be top of your to do list?

AM: England to host a World Cup - it's a disgrace it's not been here for 56 years! I'd also let VAR run and see how it develops overtime.

PA: Agree on both points. Thinking about our 2 clubs (one club), what advice would you give to our young HWJFC players who are wanting to play first team footy for HWFC one day?

AM: Aspire higher, aspire to be the best player in the world or dream of playing for England / your favourite club (which should be Hartley anyway). If it doesn't happen you can always come home. Enjoy playing, enjoy training and make sure you listen to feedback, including negativity. Enjoy your wins but always reflect on your game, and don't blame others when things don't go as you would have liked.

PA: That's top advice. As always you're looking quite dapper today, so do you think man buns and long hair are acceptable in the modern game?

AM: Hahaha, only had one when I've been a manager so I'd say they aren't acceptable. I did wear an alic band at multiple stages in my late teens / early 20s which is equally pathetic, but the vice chairman (Noaksy) did once cut my hair in 2005/2006 when I had a great bohemian 60s haircut - which he will happily tell you about if you buy him a beer!

PA: Sounds like we need to ask Noaksy to dig out some photos too. Last section of the interview, and I'm sure our Juniors would love to know a bit more about the legend that is Millers. So, who

was your favourite player when you were a young 'un?

AM: Paulo Maldini - what a player. As a fellow left back when I play and have my hair down he looks and plays just like I do..... hahaha!

PA: It's almost uncanny. And who is your favourite current player right now?

AM: The old warhorse - Chiellini

PA: Great shout, a proper pro. Your most treasured memory from your playing days?

AM: Too many - either winning the local schools cup in '97 against all odds or all the fantastic people I've met during my time. Playing in the States with a load of lads from all over the world; great team and we were very tight knit despite coming from all regions; that was pretty special.

PA: And your most treasured memory as a coach/manager?

AM: Loads, often the little ones as well that don't get notice but often end up being significant. Fleet away in the FA cup was up there, winning 4-0 in a replay against a side higher in the pyramid and hearing the songs from the crowd is very memorable. I think that's when people realised something special was about to happen! Cambridge in the playoff has to be up there as well on that roasting hot May day!

PA: Now that was a top day. So thinking about your Thursdays, who do you prefer coaching; your big lads or my U16s?!

AM: Both groups childish, insubordinate and pretend like they are listening. I have equal disdain for both!

PA: Hahaha! Finally, will you be taking over from Luke Mullen one day as HWFC Chairman?

AM: No chance! Arise Sir Steven Noakes or arise Lord Duncan Swan.


